Recollections of Branston W/T Station 1946-1954

Some fifty that years has passed since I was at the "Mere" - in consequence some memories remain Sharp- and others lost in the shuffle of confusion - !! Hence my account could were the flawed in some respects, to Sapologise of some dates and accounts are slightly misplaced .

IN BRANSTON REMEMBERED - BRANSTONS SECRET WAR A FARLY CONPREHENSIVE ACCOUNT WAS GIVEN OF THIS SMALL - BUT VITAL WIRELESS TELEGRAPPY STATION DURING THE WAR YEARS, IN THESE YEARS - LIKE SO MANY SERVICEMEN I WAS OTHER WISE ENGAGED" OVERSEAS, AND ON RETURN, MYSELF AND MANY MORE WERE DOSTED TO APPROPRIATE DUTIES IN THE UK.

I FOUND MYSELF AT BRANSTON IN 1946.

AS A RADIO OFFICER I HAD NEVER FOUND SUCH A SMALL WATCH ROOM IN ALL OF MY SERINGE . BUT IT WAS UNIQUE - SMALL BUT VERY FRIENDLY. I ALSO FOUND IT STAFFED BY VERY EXPERENCED RADIO MEN, SOME WHO HAD BEEN AT BRANSTON W/T DURING THE WAR - AND AREVIOUSLY. HOWEVER I FOUND MYSELF IN GOOD COMPANY HID SOON SETTLED IN. HERE I GO INTO MEMORY LANE BECAUSE I FIND PEOPLE MAKE PLACES - AND LINK UP LIFE FOR US - AND SO IT IS WITH BRANSTON ----

A DOZEN OR MORE OF WE "NEWCOMERS" WERE FOUND AND ACCOMODATION IN THE VILLAGE - MYSELF AND WHE MOLLIE BILL HOSKI WERE LODGED WITH MISS WEST IN SLEAFORD 20 AD; OTHERS HE JACK TONES WITH ROSE GREEN. DOUG TAYKOR WENT TO THE NEW ESTATE (AND MARRIED RENE REEDON?). I RECALL GORDON KENNEDY HAD WIFE JOYCE ; GYRIL HUMBERSTONE AND FAMILY ALL MADE WELCOME IN THE VILLAGE. INTEGRATION WAS FURTHER ADVANCED AS TIME WENT BY. WHEN MOST FORTUNATE IN BEING OFFERED A COTTAGE BY JACK HVD NANCY WESTWOOD IN SILVER STREET - AND & FRIENDSHIP GREW AND REMAINS UN DIMINISHED :

AS PREVIOUSLY MENTIONED MANY OF THE RAF STAFF HAD BEEN IN POST MANY YEARS, AND THEIR RECOLLECTIONS WERE MOST "INTERESTING - PARTICULARANY DURING THE WAR YEARS - NOW IN 1946 WE WERE ALL CIVIL SERNANTS - WITH JUST A FEW STILL IN "SMOOTH BLUE".

HOWEVER, CHANGING INTO "MUFTI" FROM BATTLEDRESS WAS THE ONLY NOTICEABLE CHANGE - THE DISCIPLINE AND LOUTINE - AND COMRADESHIP, PERSISTED!

THE FOUDER OF BRANSTON Nº! W'T WAS WING COMMANDER SWANBOROUGH, SOMETIME IN 1927; MUD THROUGHOUT THE PERIOD 1927-1954 HE REMAINED CONTROLLER, AND WAS A FREQUENT VISITOR TO THE SITE FROM CHEADLE.

IN CHARGE OF BRANSTON W/T WAS FLIGHT LIEUTENANT JOCK MURRAY ASSISTED BY FORMER SGT JACK SCOBELL.

WE WORKED IN WATCHES" (A SYSTEM OF WATCHKEEDING USED BY THE ROYAL NALLY TELEGRAPH SERVICE) THESE WERE 0800-1300445,1300 - 1600 ; 1600 - m'n , and the MIDDLE WATCH M'N - 0800 ZULU! These times WERE SUBSEQUENTLY CHANGED IN VARIOUS WAYS TO CONFORM WITH RADIO OFFICERS UNION RULES.

THE WARTIME SERVERS I REMEMBER WEARE REMAINING IN DOST IS RADIO OFFICERS WERE MAURICE NORMANI (WHO'SE WIFE PHYLUS WAS A WAAF HERE HUGH BURKHILL (WHO ASO MARRIED A WAAF), AND COMPANY TED LIDDELL ORGANISED MAN. REUNIONS POSTWAR AT THE MOOR LODGE

ITE WATCH SUPERVISOR'S IN 1946 WERE ALL STAFF WHO HAD SERVED IN THE RAF DURING PREWAR PERSIAN GULF DAYS CHARGE DREAKER FRANK HARDY CHAS STEER, JOCK THOMSON BALL PARSONS AND BALL SWAM. --- CHARLIE STEER BEING THE ODDONE OUT HAVING SERVED IN THE RM AS A SPARKER ON THE ROYAL YACAT !

THE WATCHKEEDERS WERE ALL EXSERICEMENT FROM

I CATH SAY HERE THAT IN MY 44 YEARS OF SERVICE IN RADIO I HAVE NEVER WORKED WITH A MORE DISTINGUISHED AND HAPPY GROUP THAN THESE.

OTHER THAN THE OPERATIONAL STAFF AT THE MERE, VITAL SERVICES WERE ALSO CARRIED OUT BY LOCALLY EMPROYED STAFF.

CHARME BARNES - A WIZAD WITH BRUSH AND BUCKET -AND OUR DRIVER GEORGE CREASY WHO FETCHED AND CARRIED NOT ONLY VITAL DACKAGES BUT FEARY'D FAMILIES AND FURNITURE ABOUT BRANSTON AND WAS A SOURCE OF ALL KNOWLEDGE ON INTIMETE OCCURENCES IN THE VILLAGE. HE ALSO ZEDMRED BIKES.

CYCLING TO THE MERE BEDAME A HAZARD DURING THE HEAVY SNOW FARLS IN 1946-7 - ATID THEN IMPOSSIBLE - AND THE LONG WALK TO THE MERE AND BACK BEDAME THE NORM FOR MONTHS -

BUT THE OTHER HAZARD CYCLING UP MERE ROAD ON NIGHT WATCH WAS P.C. JACKSONI. LAMPS THAT FAILED AND POOR REFRECTORS WERE HIS DELIGHT, MID APPREMENSION WAS CERTAIN ONCE HE HAD GUGHT UP WITH US. BUT P.C JACKOON WAS A VERY GOOD BOBBY - HE AZWAYS LET US OFF.

Socially, THE MERE STAFF WERE ALWAYS MADE WELCOME BY BRANSTON RESIDENTS IN MANY AREAS OF ACTIVITY. Fancy Dress Dances at the Village Hell were week supported by staff in Various disquees - I recall arab slicks were common place, and scatteerours and Bisto girls very popular. The Branston Crecket Chubs annual Suppor presided over by Mr Joung, with the Vielege Butcher providing a huge stuffed Gline is well remembered. as loas grick Tones impromte songs at the piano The Wheeless Station Brecket Team formed in 1947 initially had no Field, no gear and a pavelion was a pipe dream - But not for long. Jours Truly took advantage of an Auction Sale at Lincoln Martet . The Linevenchine Regiment was seeling of all its Sports gear after an Overseas Tour. With cash raised in Raffles ite, I took off week some E25 and was able to purchase pads, balls illats and sufficient for our reeds. Gredet Caps & badges were later accord. The badge was this !a Simple Electric Hask! my THE CRICKET FIELD WAS KINDLY LENT TO IS BY MR BRANKSTON OF SPRINGFIELD, UP MERE RD; ND A WICKET WAS PREPARED WITH THE AID OF BILLY FORMANS TROLDRIVEN ROAD ROLLER! - THE PAVILLON WAS AN OD CHICKEN SHED CRUBAGD OUT WITH JEYES FLUID, PAINTED & WHITEWASHED, WE JOINED TE ENCLOSED GROUNDS LEANGUE AND ENJOYED MANY SEASONS CRICKET. ITTERHANNORTH WAS AZWAYS A FANDURIE AWAY FIXTURE - MAINLY FOR ITS STASTIC TEAS. THE TEA LADIES WERE MAS DAY AND DAUGHTERS - THE TEAM WAS GUESS WHAT - WELL AT LEAST 6 MR DAYS WERE LISTED , STONE ONCE STOOD AT THE SITE ENTRANGE AT THE MERE :-AM STILL REGARD THIS AS A TALISMAN TO ALL WHO WORKED Nº1 ERE THE FIRST HIR MINISTRY STATION EVER With all 1 D SIGNIFICANTLY IT BRANSTON -
